COVID-19 Q & A of the Day

Question: What exactly does 'older' adults mean?

Answer: CDC says “older adults” and people with serious chronic medical conditions are at higher risk of getting very sick from this illness. Anyone over 60 and those with underlying health problems should try to avoid places with large crowds – such as movie theaters, busy malls and even religious services, infectious disease experts say. “This ought to be at the top of the mind for people over 60, and those with underlying health problems,” said Dr. William Schaffner, a Vanderbilt University professor and longtime CDC adviser. But why is age 60 often used as a threshold for those who need to be extra cautious? “The average age of death for people from COVID-19 is 80 and the average age of people who need medical attention is 60,” US Surgeon General Jerome Adams said.
