Positive COVID-19 Test Results

Case #41: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a female in her 60s in Madison County. This individual was not hospitalized and is recovering at home. Community transmission of COVID-19 is identified as the source of exposure.

COVID-19 Q & A of the Day

Question: Should the community expect to see a COVID-19 vaccine soon?

Answer: Quickly developing a vaccine for COVID-19 is a topic that has been challenging. We have better technology than ever before but it is estimated that possibly, within the next 12 to 18 months, there could be a vaccine available. The community shouldn't pin all their hopes on that though. There are things right now they can be doing to keep themselves and their families safe like washing their hands, covering their cough, staying home if they feel sick, avoiding people who are sick, cleaning and disinfecting surfaces, not touching their face, and practicing social distancing (maintaining 6 feet of space between people). All these things help to slow and or prevent the spread of infectious diseases.
