Positive COVID-19 Test Results

Case #57: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a female in her 70s in Bonneville County. This individual is not hospitalized. Source of exposure to COVID-19 is unknown at this time.

Case #58: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a female in her 20s in Bonneville County. This individual is not hospitalized. Contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 has been identified as the source of exposure.

Case #59: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a female in her 50s in Bonneville County. This individual is not hospitalized. Community transmission has been identified as the source of exposure to COVID-19.

Case #60: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a male in his 40s in Bonneville County. This individual is not hospitalized. Community transmission has been identified as the source of exposure to COVID-19.

COVID-19 Q & A of the Day

Question: What are the primary modes of transmission for SARS-CoV-2 (the virus that causes COVID-19)?

Answer: According to CDC, the primary and most important mode of transmission for COVID-19 is through close contact (less than 6' for greater than 10 minutes) from person-to-person. Based on data from lab studies on COVID-19 and what we know about similar respiratory diseases, it is possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or possibly their eyes, but this isn't thought to be the main way the virus is spread.
