COVID-19 Daily Report Saturday May 30, 2020

Positive COVID-19 Test Results

We have five new positive cases to report today.

Case #61: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a male in his 60s in Fremont County. This individual's hospitalization status and source of exposure to COVID-19 is unknown at this time.

Case #62: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a female in her 40s in Bonneville County. This individual's hospitalization status and source of exposure to COVID-19 is unknown at this time.

Case #63: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a female in her 20s in Bonneville County. This individual is not hospitalized and is recovering at home. Contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 has been identified as the source of exposure.

Case #64: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a female aged 0-19 in Bonneville County. This individual's hospitalization status is unknown at this time. Contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 has been identified as the source of exposure.

Case #65: We are reporting a positive COVID-19 test result for a female aged 0-19 in Madison County. This individual is not hospitalized and is recovering at home. Community transmission has been identified as the source of exposure to COVID-19.

COVID-19 Q & A of the Day

Question: When should you seek emergency medical attention for COVID-19?

Answer: Look for emergency warning signs (this list is not all inclusive) for COVID-19. If someone is showing any of these signs, seek emergency medical care immediately: trouble breathing, persistent pain or pressure in the chest, new confusion, inability to wake or stay awake, or bluish lips/face. Please call your medical provider for any other symptoms that are severe or concerning to you.

Call 911 or call ahead to your local emergency facility. Notify the operator that you are seeking care for someone who has or may have COVID-19.
