

Hypertension and Diabetes Enhanced Provider Outreach


The State of Idaho has partnered with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to support efforts to prevent and control diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. Through a federal grant, known as the 1305 Subgrant, the State of Idaho is now partnering with Idaho's Public Health Districts to launch an initiative aimed at working with local health systems and communities. The focus of this community-based partnership is to mitigate and prevent complications associated with the prevalence of diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. The ultimate goal is to create better access to care and healthier lives for Idaho citizens.

Priority III of the 1305 Subgrant, asks that the District partner with local clinics to promote the creation of patient registries and standardized referral processes focusing on hypertension, diabetes, and prediabetes. The State has provided us with limited funds to pass-through to clinics interested in implementing such a project.

Acceptable uses for funds include:

- Pay for staff hours associated with the workflow implementation
- Purchase of Electronic Health Record Modules
- American Association of Diabetes Educators (AADE) Training for staff
- Attending the Collaborating for Health Conference in Boise, Idaho.
- Attending a workshop highlighting local diabetes prevention and management resources.

Other uses for funds may be acceptable, but will need to be reviewed and authorized by Nicole Runner with the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare.



Projects must be completed no later than June 10th, 2016 in order to receive the reimbursement pass-through funds.
