Plugged Duct

A plugged duct is a tender lump caused by clogged milk flow.

Symptoms

- Hard lump/knot felt in the breast
- White bleb on surface of nipple
- Tenderness
- Reddening
- Gradual onset
- Usually on one breast

Causes

- Poor latch
- Baby not feeding well
- Pressure on the breast Tight bra

Tight bra Wearing breast shells Mom sleeping on her stomach Tight baby carrier

Comfort Measures

- Apply moist heat prior to nursing or expressing
- Finger massage lump in firm, circular motion
- Position baby's chin in line with plugged duct
- Breastfeed more to empty breasts
- Loosen tight bras or clothes

Prevention

- Breastfeed on demand
- Vary nursing positions
- Correct latch
- Avoid tight nursing bras, clothes, or baby carriers
